

EAA Chapter 20 Aviation Scholarship

2017

EAA Chapter 20 has made \$2000 available for up to two flying scholarships in the 2017 calendar year. It is the intent of the chapter to grow the size of the scholarships in the future.

Applications close July 31, 2017, The goals of these scholarships are to:

1. Augment initial flying training for an individual that has not had previous flight training experience.
2. Assist a pilot training to obtain an advanced rating (such as, but not limited to, Commercial, Instructor, or Instrument).
3. Augment training for an individual training in aircraft maintenance (such as, but not limited to, A&P or IA).

The student contribution will be \$20 per flight hour. The Chapter 20 scholarship will pay the remainder directly to the aircraft provider and instructor up to \$1000. The recipient may apply for further scholarship awards, but must completely spend the prior award money before applying again.

The criteria for the initial Flight Training scholarship are:

1. Be 16 to 21 years old at the time of application.
2. Be able to meet the medical requirements of a student pilot license.
3. Have demonstrated interest in aviation.
4. Have at least a 2.5/4.0 GPA in high school/college.
5. Be a resident of San Francisco, San Mateo, or Santa Clara county.
6. Must become a student member of EAA Chapter 20.

The criteria for the Advanced Flying scholarship are:

1. Hold a private pilot license.
2. Have started study for an advanced rating.
3. Be a resident of San Francisco, San Mateo, or Santa Clara county.
4. Must become a student member of EAA Chapter 20.

The criteria for a non-flying award will be individually based.

To apply for these scholarships, please address the following information requirements in one page up to 500 words and mail to EAA Chapter 20, 620 Airport Way, San Carlos, CA 94070.

1. Scholarship you are applying for (Initial Flying Training or Advanced Rating).
2. Name, address, and phone contact information.
3. Email address.
4. Age.

5. Flying experience.
6. Are you currently receiving financial assistance for flight training?
7. Describe your interest in aviation. What activities have you participated in to further this interest? What are your flying goals?
8. What are your recent academic grades?
9. Have you participated in the Young Eagles program? In what capacity?
